- Up-to-date and accurate evacuation plans for each residence hall

We were able to customize the course with extra personalized content, including policies and procedures and evacuation plans.















Format

- Students enter through Canvas
- Starts with Presentation
- Review Policies
- Review Escape Routes
- Quiz
- Survey
- Certificate of Completion




Let's see the course!

Implementation

- Residence students went from 8,000 to 3,000 in light of the current pandemic.
- We launched through our university LMS, Canvas.
- Notified Residence Life & Community Directors to help remind student population of the course.
 - Community Email Bursts
 - Notifying RAs to add to floor meeting agendas
- We sent notifications that required resident students to take the course by September 4, 2020.

Implementation (cont.)

- Allowed us to view who completed the course on time, late or not at all!
- Able to analyze grade averages of students that completed the course.
- Luckily, 100% of students that remained in campus housing (after a significant number canceled their housing) completed.



Timeline

- Started conversations in July.
- Notified Campus IT/Canvas Support of implementation following initial conversations.
- Late July Zoom meetings regarding course building, customization, and proposed date of launching course.
- Week of August 4th Team tested course with help of MSU Fire Safety Student Staff for further insight.
- Week of August 11th Advised Residence Life Staff of Course posting on Canvas.
- Launched August 18th
- Students required to finish by September 4, 2020.

Results


Survey Says!

- 88% of participants increased their awareness of fire safety
- 87% of participants feel better equipped to handle a fire safety situation
- 86% of participants feel more inclined to prevent fires
- Average grade: 96%
